


The NHS and the Arc - why now is the right time

ICSs in Oxford-Cambridge Arc

 4 Integrated Care Systems in 3 different NHS Regions

- Integrated Care Boards being created as statutory NHS organisations on 1 July, subject to passage of legislation
- Integrated Care Partnerships
- Permissive legislation
- Focus on systems and collaboration
- Local Authority "member(s)" will sit on the Board of the ICB



Integrated Care Systems



Partnerships of health and care organisations to achieve four aims:

- Improve outcomes in population health and healthcare
- Tackle inequalities in outcomes, experience and access
- Enhance productivity and value for money
- Help the NHS support broader social and economic development

And an increased focus on:

- Health and wellbeing
- Prevention
- Health inequalities

Integrated Care White Paper



- Stresses the importance of "place" (not defined)
- Place leader, developing and delivering place plan
- Place leader to be agreed jointly being NHS and LAs
- Place governance structures and expectation of increasing delegation of budgets to "place"

Other points



- Importance of wider determinants of health
- Massive push on sustainability
- Interplay between spatial plans and NHS infrastructure
- NHS is often the largest local employer
- Strong links to research and life sciences sector
- Access to Government

Conclusion



- Now is the right time for the NHS to be a key partner in The Arc
- Keen to co-develop a focussed core proposition for The Arc that has health and wellbeing as a key component of that core proposition
- Need to work out what is done at scale on what is done more locally
